



Sixth Form Student Dress Code

The manner in which students dress for school should reflect their intention to work as young adults in a learning environment. Sixth Formers are given the freedom to wear their own clothes but need to remember that they are role models and leaders to students in the lower school community and should dress appropriately.

The dress code allows for individual choice of clothing in keeping with the above principles. When selecting clothing for sixth form, we suggest students ask themselves the following question:

“Is what I am wearing appropriate for a school working day or should I leave it for the weekend?”

In order to dress appropriately for a school environment, we do ask that students **not** wear the following:

- Clothing with logos that may be considered offensive or inappropriate
- Very short shorts or skirts
- Inappropriate fashion such as halter neck tops (backless), Bardot tops, tube tops, cropped tops (where a student’s mid-section is exposed), sheer/see-through
- No beach style flip-flops or excessively high shoes/boots
- No fishnet tights
- Low slung jeans
- Onesies/pyjamas or other bedwear

If **any** member of staff considers that what a student is wearing is inappropriate they will speak with them away from other students and may request that they alter their clothing. The sixth form team can request individuals to leave the site due to inappropriate dress. If this should happen their parent/guardian will be called.

Continued inappropriate dress will lead to a verbal/Level 1 warning.
