### Purpose of task:

To increase your knowledge and understanding of current politics. To prepare students for Politics A level.

# Task: PLEASE COMPLETE ALL OF THE TASKS BELOW

- 1. Learn the one sentence definitions for the key words below. There will be a short test on these in one of the first lessons.
- 2. Watch one TV news programmes e.g. Newsnight, Question Time, Sunday with Laura Kuenssberg etc. and WRITE A TWO PAGE REPORT including: Which ONE story in the news you thought was most important, roughly what it was about and why you thought it was most important.
- 3. Create a timeline of the Prime Ministers from 1979-2024 include their political party and election result.
- 4. Summarise the key manifesto policies in the 2024 general election. For at least 4 political parties.
- 5. Then select three policies (one from each political party) and explain why you support OR do not support that policy. If you want to extend yourself and go further, you can do more than 3.

### **KEYWORDS TO LEARN**

Main law making body in the UK consisting of House of Commons and House of Lords
Those members of the Commons and Lords chosen (by the leader of the largest party
in the Commons) to run the country
The 20 or so most important members of the Government
The leader of the largest party in the Commons
Another word for members of the Government – each Minister (there are over 100)
is usually given responsibility for a policy area such as Health or Schools
Leader of the largest party that opposes the Government
Nearly all adults (over 18) will be entitled to vote for a candidate to represent their
local community (eg West Dorset or South Dorset) in the Westminster parliament
Group of people who share the same political beliefs and try to get elected – main
parties in the UK are Conservatives, Greens, Labour, Liberal Democrat and UK
Independence Party
Organisation that campaigns to persuade Government but does not stand for election
like a party does eg Friends of the Earth
